A cooking class with County Food & Nutrition taught the kids how to make yummy snacks and the importance of washing your hands. Here staff uses a black light to show germs. Yuck.



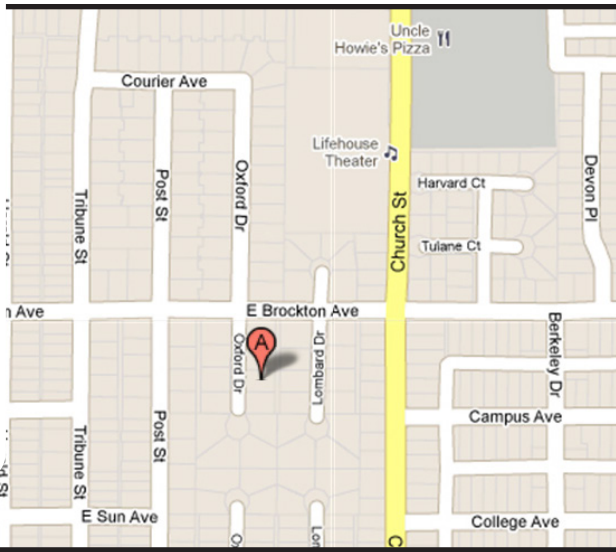
STEM activities teach students while engaging them in fun art projects.



Students enjoy planting and harvesting in our Oxford location garden.

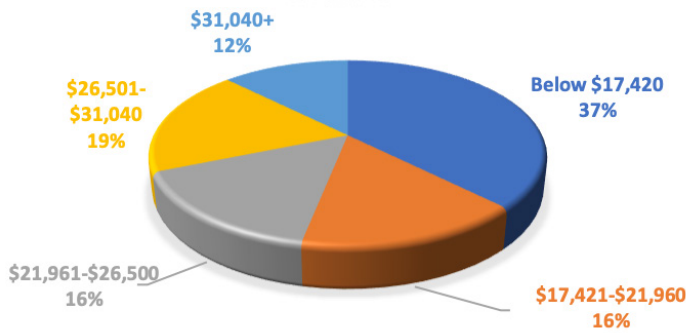

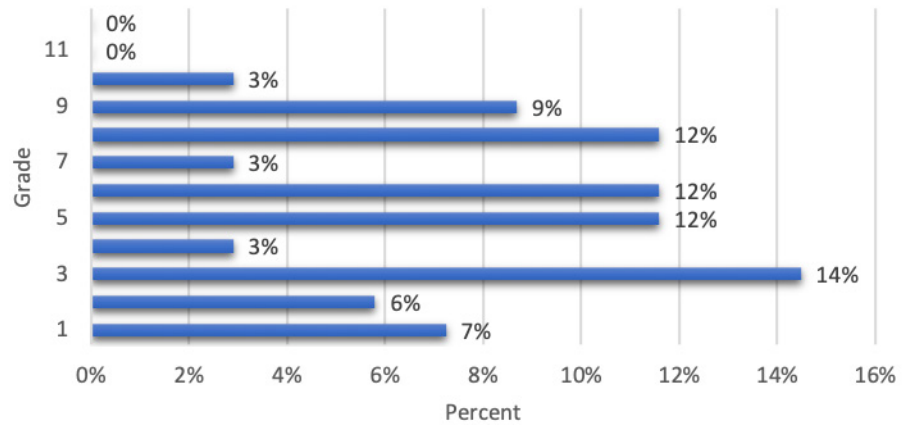

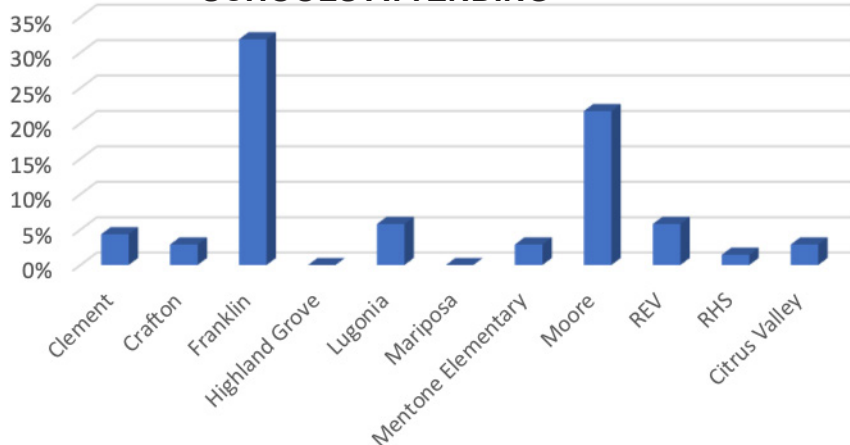

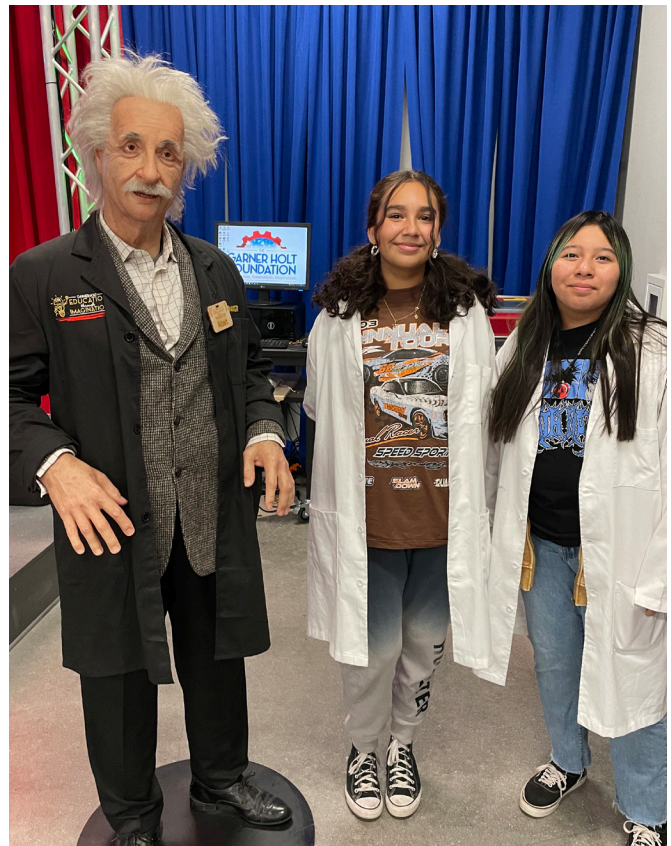

Enrichment and literacy are staples for students at Micah House. Students reading levels are assessed at the beginning of the school year and we are able to strategically pinpoint areas of greatest concern. Our Academic Enrichment Director works with the school to set and meet yearly reading goals.

Volunteers read with students one-on-one to assist in tracking challenges in phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension.

Students also participate in comprehension and vocabulary games as well as games that encourage thinking and strategy and help improve understanding and visual discernment.

Enrichment and STEM classes combine science, art, comprehension and fun to help students flourish academically.



Literacy is not just about reading books, it involves comprehension and understanding.

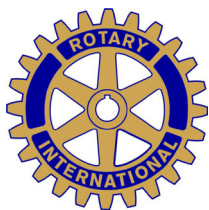
