We serve students at our two locations, Chapel Street and Oxford Drive.











When homework seems hard, having a dedicated volunteer makes all the difference.







LITERACY PROGRAM

Students are assessed at the beginning of the school year and we are able to strategically pinpoint areas of greatest concern. Our literacy coordinator then works with the school to set and meet yearly reading goals.

Volunteers read with students one-on-one to assist in tracking challenges in phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension.

Students have the opportunity to not only read one-on-one, but participate in comprehension and vocabulary games as well as games that encourage thinking and strategy and help improve understanding and visual discernment.

We evaluate progress throughout the year to ensure students continue to advance in reading level and comprehension.

Students typically advance one reading level by the end of the year.


